Apostolic Letter Opens Year of the Eucharist

Pope John Paul II has released a new apostolic letter, *Mane Nobiscum Domine*, opening the Year of the Eucharist.

In the 32-page document, the Holy Father indicates that he had planned for some time to declare a Year of the Eucharist. He says that he hopes the initiative will lead to a deeper appreciation for the central role of the Eucharist in the life of the Church, a greater respect for the norms of the liturgy, a more reverent attitude toward the Blessed Sacrament, and a more active participation in Sunday Mass. [The full Italian text of the Pope's apostolic letter is available on the Vatican web site. Translations into other languages, including English, will soon be available at the same site.]

Mane Nobiscum Domine is the third in a series of recent documents on the Eucharist. Pope John Paul offered his encyclical letter *Ecclesia de Eucharistia* (doc) in April 2003; it was followed one year later by an instruction on liturgical abuses, *Redemptionis Sacramentum* (doc), prepared by the Congregation for Divine Worship.

The Year of the Eucharist, the Pope reminds his readers in his new apostolic letter, will begin with the International Eucharistic Congress in Guadalajara, Mexico, on October 10-17, and run through the next session of the Synod of Bishops, which will meet in Rome in October of next year, to discuss the topic of the Eucharist in the life of the Church.

The Eucharist, John Paul writes, opens the possibility for "a culture of dialogue." In a world torn by tragedy and terrorism, the Church finds in the Blessed Sacrament "a great school of peace."

While he lauds the results of the liturgical reform that allows the reading of the Scriptures in the vernacular language, the Holy Father cautions that these readings must be done with reverence and attended with care. He also calls for a greater sense of solemnity in the celebration of the Mass.

Cardinal Francis Arinze, the prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship, introduced the apostolic letter to the media at an October 8 press conference at the Vatican. Calling the text "beautiful and incisive," the

African prelate said that it could help to guide the faithful to deepen their spiritual lives during the Year of the Eucharist.

The theme of Mane Nobiscum Domine, Cardinal Arinze observed, is “the story of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus.” The text opens with the words of those disciples to Jesus: “Stay with us, for it is toward evening.” In the Eucharist, Cardinal Arinze said, “Jesus continues to walk with us and to introduce us to the mysteries of God.”

The cardinal said that in this apostolic letter, John Paul II challenges the faithful to attain “a renewed awareness of the incomparable treasure that Christ has entrusted to his Church.” Mane Nobiscum Domine does not call for any special new initiatives, he observed; rather, the Pope urges all Catholics to observe the Year of the Eucharist through regular participation in the Mass, following the regular sacramental life of the Church “with great spiritual intensity.”

2004 Christmas Tree Fundraiser — Need Volunteers!

- (4) Team members to sell the trees on their scheduled days. **You can commit as few as just one two-hour hour shift.**

Details and scheduling choices will be provided once you sign up. Many veteran Christmas tree volunteers return year after year. We look forward to seeing you again.

For the newer Knights, this is a great way to meet other brothers in our council and get involved in one of our most fun events of the year.
