KOC Supports Television Programs on Famous Catholic Shrines

Public television stations throughout the United States will telecast programs on famous Catholic shrines to Our Lady. The programs are part of Burt Wolf's Travels and Traditions series, which is carried on many public television stations.

"The Knights of Columbus is honored and pleased to have been a part of the development team for the programs," said Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson.

In February, public television stations began telecasting the first in the programs about the Catholic shrines, The Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The program explained how the Virgin of Guadalupe became a symbol of hope and freedom for native Indians of Mexico as well as the Spanish settlers.

"This is the first of a series of programs highlighting locations around the world that are sacred to the Catholic Church," Anderson said.

Other programs in Wolf's series on the shrines to Our Lady of Czestochowa in Poland and Our Lady of Lourdes in France. Some programs feature Knights of Columbus visiting these well-known shrines.

"As the most important Catholic site in the New World, the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe has a fascinating story, which is clearly presented in this program," Anderson added. Each year 20 million people visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, making it the second most visited Catholic shrine in the world next to the Vatican. Wolf's program looks at the extraordinary circumstances surrounding the Blessed Virgin's appearance to St. Juan Diego in 1531 and the subsequent popularity of Our Lady of Guadalupe among the faithful. The Order's role in promoting devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe is discussed. Also examined were the history, culture, architecture, art, music, food and festival associated with the shrine and its pilgrims.

NOTE — The only program scheduled to air in the Washington, D.C. area is the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe on June 20 at 4:30 p.m., on WNVC-TV.
